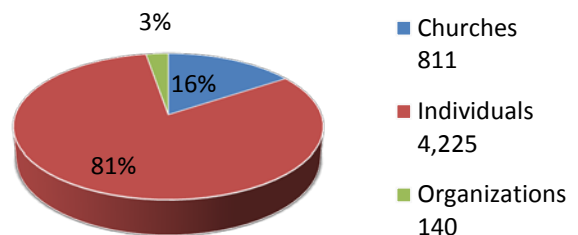
Sources of Income

2009 Highlights

As a mission, there is nothing more important to us than changed lives, people embracing Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, receiving forgiveness and new life in Him. A close second is birthing new churches, God's best way to reach new people for Christ and equip them as life-long disciples. Though the health and progress of the Mission pales in comparison to the above two key result areas, here's my top ten list of 2009 highlights.

- ◆ **Missionary Family Grows**

During 2009, 28 new missionaries were appointed. When spouses are included, the total number of additions to our missionary family is 38. Starting the year with 318 missionaries and spouses, we finished the year with 327 for a net gain of 9.

- ◆ **Campus Ambassadors Housing Venture**

The dream of a ministry house that would also generate financial support for campus missionaries was realized with the purchase of a house in Worcester, Massachusetts, on March 6, 2009.

- ◆ **Board Experiences Ministry in New York City**

In April the Board and Executive Leadership Team traveled to New York City to catch a glimpse of city and specialized ministries and interact with our team of missionaries in the Big Apple.

- ◆ **Veteran Missionaries Officially Retire**

Jacques and Loretta Alexanian officially retired in 2009 after 48 years of ministry in Quebec. Similarly, N.T. and Joy Dellinger retired after over 47 years of ministry in Belize.

- ◆ **Boot Camp Assists Missionaries with Partner Development**

During 2009, a number of Missions Door missionaries attended Boot Camp training in various locations across the country. With 51 missionaries to date having received this training, we are seeing significant progress in support discovery.

- ◆ **Campus Ambassadors (CA) Staff Forum**

In June, CA staff from across the country gathered in Prescott, Arizona, to reflect back on the past and look forward to the future. Bill Johnson, the first CA, was one of several special speakers.

- ◆ **Executive Leadership Team**

Mark Baker and Joaquin Vargas were named as Ministry Vice Presidents. Grey Jeffreys transitioned to three days a week beginning in July.

- ◆ **Computer and Software Enhancements**

New software and web-based financial reports became available to missionaries and will provide better tools for support maintenance and financial tracking.

- ◆ **Development of New Fields of Ministry**

Progress was made in 2009 toward the development of ministry in Liberia, China and the Bahamas. U.S. State Department approval was received for mission personnel to travel to Cuba.

- ◆ **Dollars and Cents**

In one of the worst economic years in history, our income in 2009 was down 1.1 percent from our record income in 2008. We finished the year "in the black," with total income of \$8,630,835.
