2010 Highlights

As a mission, there is nothing more important to us than changed lives, people embracing Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, receiving forgiveness and new life in Him. A close second is birthing new faith communities, God's best way to reach new people for Christ and equip them as life-long disciples. In addition to the "score card" of key results listed on the other side of this annual report, here are several notable highlights from 2010.

◆ **New Missionaries**

During 2010, 23 new missionaries were appointed. When spouses are included, the total number of additions to our missionary family is 29. We finished the year with 311 missionaries and spouses.

◆ **Haiti Relief and Development**

The devastating earthquake on January 12 resulted in much death and discouragement, but also great opportunities for ministry. We received over \$715,000 to assist with the immediate crisis and ongoing development needs. Our indigenous Haitian missionaries provided excellent leadership in Haiti, including the hosting of work teams from the U.S., largely facilitated by ministry partner DELTA Ministries.

◆ **Board Experiences Ministry in Nogales, Mexico & Tucson, Arizona**

In April the Board and Executive Leadership Team traveled to Nogales to catch a glimpse of ministry in Mexico, including church planting, prison ministry and Nogales Seminary. The vision trip included exposure to the campus (University of Arizona) and church-planting ministries in Tucson.

◆ **New Churches Launched**

Thirty-nine new churches were birthed in 2010. These included a Haitian church in Metro New York, a Portuguese-language church in East Providence, Rhode Island, and a French-language congregation in Montreal. A network of house churches in the Denver area was formed under the name of Soma Christou Communities. New churches were also started in the Dominican Republic, Haiti, Mexico and Central America.

◆ **Campus Ministry Expands**

Six new campus ministries have been launched and a new missions' initiative is being developed. The Campus Ambassadors Housing Venture that opened in 2009 is providing housing and funding for ministry in Worcester, Massachusetts.

◆ **Cambodia Training Center Dedicated**

The dream of a ministry training center in Siem Reap, Cambodia was realized. The center was dedicated on October 30 and is now being used to train leaders for evangelical churches in Cambodia.

◆ **Radio Station HRVC Celebrates 50 Years of Ministry**

In Tegucigalpa, Honduras, from December 8-10, the 50th Anniversary of the ministry of Radio Station HRVC was celebrated. Known as *the Evangelical Voice of Honduras*, former missionaries and staff of the station were joined by notable dignitaries, including the President of Honduras and evangelist Alberto Mottes, to celebrate what God has accomplished through this ministry over the past half century.

◆ **Development of New Fields of Ministry**

New ministry opportunities are being pursued in China, India, Laos, Vietnam, Cuba, and the city of Baltimore. New ministry has begun in Monrovia (Liberia), Toronto (among Hindus and Muslims), and the Bahamas.

◆ **Dollars and Cents**

In another difficult economic year, our income in 2010 was up 1.1 percent from 2009, making it the second best income year in our history. We finished the year with total income of \$8,722,114.
