Financial Philosophy & Practice

In order for the Mission to operate on a sound financial basis, the cost of maintaining a missionary in ministry needs to be underwritten before ministry begins. This is done by securing commitments from churches, organizations, and individuals.

Core Biblical Beliefs & Values

The following statements express the core biblical beliefs and values that guide the work and relationships of Missions Door. Only those persons who, without reservation, fully and freely endorse these statements are eligible to serve in any capacity with the Mission. In Step 3 of the application process a signature will be required affirming your (and your spouse's) commitment to these truths and willingness to comply with our policies.

Doctrinal Statement

We believe that the Bible is God's Word, that it was written by men divinely and uniquely inspired, that it is absolutely trustworthy and has supreme authority in all matters of faith and conduct.

We believe in God the Father, Creator of heaven and earth, perfect in holiness, infinite in wisdom, measureless in power. We rejoice that He concerns Himself mercifully in the affairs of men, that He hears and answers prayer and that He saves from sin and death all who come to Him through Jesus Christ.

We believe in Jesus Christ, God's only begotten Son, conceived of the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, sinless in His life, making atonement for the sin of the world by His death on the cross. We believe in His bodily resurrection, His ascension into heaven, His high-priestly intercession for His people and His personal, visible return to the world according to His promise.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, who came forth from God to convince the world of sin, of righteousness and of judgment, and to regenerate, sanctify and comfort those who believe in Jesus Christ.

We believe that all men by nature and by choice are sinners, but that "God so loves the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." We believe, therefore, that those who accept Christ as their Lord and Savior will rejoice forever in God's presence and those who refuse to accept Christ as Lord and Savior will be forever separated from God.

We believe in the Church—a living, spiritual body of which Christ is the Head and of which all regenerated people are members. We believe that a visible church is a company of believers in Jesus Christ, buried with Him in baptism and associated for worship, work and fellowship. We believe that to these visible churches were committed for observance "till He come" the ordinances of baptism and the Lord's Supper; and that God has laid upon these churches the task of persuading a lost world to accept Jesus Christ as Savior and to enthrone Him as Lord and Master. We believe that human betterment and social improvement are essential products of the gospel.

We believe that every human being is responsible to God alone in all matters of faith.

We believe that each church is independent and autonomous and must be free from interference by any ecclesiastical or political authority; that, therefore, Church and State must be kept separate as having different functions, each fulfilling its duties free from the dictation or patronage of the other.

Gifts of the Spirit

Missions Door recognizes the baptism in the Holy Spirit to be a sovereign act of the Lord Jesus Christ given to all believers at the moment of rebirth. This is the baptism promised by John the Baptist and declared by the Apostle Paul to be the experience of all who have been reborn.

Spiritual gifts have as their primary purpose the upbuilding of the body of Christ. Their exercise cannot be disassociated from the new birth or from the whole body of biblical theology. The test of validity is not experience but the authority of the Scripture.

Spiritual gifts are bestowed by a sovereign act of God and their exercise must be in accord with the prescribed order of the New Testament.

Unity and Ethics

Each minister is expected to promote a spirit of unity and harmony on the field and among fellow workers. In the spirit of prayer, the minister should seek to solve any difficulties or misunderstandings that may arise.
