Ministry Focus

Paul was appointed by Missions Door in 2014 serving as a missionary in Honduras. Paul and Tania desire to lead men, women and children to Christ and disciple them to impact future generations. They serve as church planters in the city of Comayagua, as well as the village of Dintel, El Paraiso, located in the mountains of Comayagua, and passionately take the Word of God to the unreached.

Paul and Tania also work with children, youth and young adults in schools and colleges. They present the gospel through evangelism, drama, and youth counseling. Rural areas are some of the poorest areas in Honduras and many children receive only one meal a day. Through Sunday school, Paul and Tania are able give snacks to the children.

They also lead ministries for families. With a high percentage of men suffering alcoholism and unemployment, the Steer's ministry teaches parenting skills, offers counseling for alcoholism, leads biblical discipleship, and gives theological education.

They have also developed Bible studies designed specifically for women. In Honduras, women suffer social inequality and this ministry is meant to help women heal both physically and emotionally from abuse. This ministry also empowers women to financially contribute to their families, offering workshops in making and selling hand-made crafts.

Faith Story

In 2004, Paul met the Lord while listening to a preacher on the radio. He wanted to grow with other believers and learn how to live in close relationship with Christ.

In 2006, God called Paul to ministry. Since then, he has been submersed in church activities, serving in Sunday school ministry to children ages 9-13 and adult Sunday school. Paul has served as chairman for the regional board of churches of Comayagua, La Paz, Francisco Morazan, Intibucá and Danli.

Tania received the Lord as a child 1981 through church. Being young when she gave her life to Christ, she recommitted her life to the Lord in 2007.
