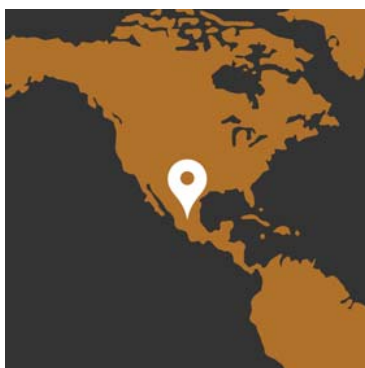

Ministry Focus

Elohim was appointed with Missions Door in 2006 serving with Campus Ambassadors in Hermosillo, Mexico. Elohim and Karla's vision is to inspire a "Generation with Direction" and to see an entire generation living according to the Bible and fulfilling God's redemptive purposes for the world.

The University of Sonora Hermosillo Campus houses just over 22,000 students.
