- Thanks for the Feedback by Stone & Heen Thanks for the Feedback is a potentially life-changing look at one of the toughest but most important parts of life: receiving feedback. It's a road map to less defensiveness, more self-awareness, greater learning, and richer relationships.
- **The Sacred Romance** by Brent Curtis The Sacred Romance invites us to find the peace and purpose we crave by slowing down, asking questions, and deepening our relationship with God. Eldredge and Curtis believe that modern Christians have lost touch with our hearts.

At the very beginning, Richard Stearns was an atheist.

- When God's Ways Make No Sense by Crabb In this powerful exploration of God's often mysterious and counterintuitive ways, Dr. Larry Crabb challenges readers to seize the opportunities for growth and maturity that come our way when we experience troubles and failures.
- The Intangibles of Leadership by R Davis The Intangibles of Leadership: The 10 Qualities of Superior Executive Performance by Richard A. Davis draws attention to characteris- tics of exceptional leaders and challenges readers to critically think about their own behaviours and where these characteristics may fit within their own leadership.
- Making Sense out of Suffering by Peter Kreeft his book is for anyone who has ever wept and wondered, "Why?" Peter Kreeft observes that our world is full of billions of normal lives that have been touched by apparently pointless and random suffering.
