LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

I am truly blessed to have a front-row seat to witness God's extraordinary work around the world through Missions Door. The view is nothing short of awe-inspiring, as our extraordinary God accomplishes remarkable feats through His exceptional people. The year 2024 has been a testament to this divine orchestration, and I'm thrilled to share some highlights with you. In just the last two years, we've seen God's hand move in powerful ways:

1. Our missionary applications have surged, increasing fivefold beyond our current capacity.
2. After five challenging years, we've halted our fiscal decline. This year's financial performance matched last year's, with a significant rise in donations - a clear demonstration of our supporters' incredible generosity and commitment.
3. For the first time in many years, we appointed more missionaries than left due to attrition (mostly retirements). Praise God, our missionary force is growing! It's admittedly a slight increase but believe it's a good harbinger of things to come.

Globally, lives continue to be transformed, and new churches are being planted and nurtured. Rather than simply providing one-off statistics, we're establishing baselines and trend lines from our missionaries' reports to better illustrate God's expanding kingdom through Missions Door. I look forward to sharing these insights in future annual reports.

Organizationally, we've achieved our vision for 2024 by "building loops" - establishing an online store (heart), creating internal training options (head), developing mobile applications (hands), and crafting a 7-week series to help local churches make a missional impact (feet).

Our efforts in 2023 (clarity and continuity) and 2024 (building loops) have set a strong foundation for positively impacting our organizational culture in 2025. I believe we're on the cusp of something truly special - a unique alignment of our missionary force with historic opportunity and blessing.

As Henry Blackaby wisely said, "See where God is working in your world – and join Him in that work." I invite you to continue linking arms with Missions Door. God is working through us in the world, and your partnership is invaluable in His divine mission. We're Better Together!

Thank you for being an essential part of this extraordinary journey. Together, we're witnessing and participating in the expansion of God's kingdom and the transformation of society through His local church.

As Vice President of Ministry for Missions Door, I am thrilled to reflect on 2024—a year marked by audacious faith, transformative outreach, and the unstoppable spread of the Gospel.

This year, I had the privilege of journeying deep into the Amazon to meet with our local multiplier serving the Tsimané tribe, a castaway ethnic group with a deep spiritual hunger. Missions Door remains the only mission working among the Tsimané, and through our local multiplier's tireless efforts, we are witnessing the seeds of revival take root in this forgotten corner of the world.

Our mission to reach castaway groups—whether ethnic, socio-economic, or societal—has flourished. In the U.S., our thriving ministries among first-generation Chinese, Ethiopian, Liberian, Cambodian, and Japanese communities are bringing hope and healing into incredibly broken spaces. In Canada, our national expert on homelessness is redefining what outreach to the marginalized and forgotten looks like. From the Eastern to Western Seaboards, our recovery ministries and church plants are transforming lives among those battling addiction. These missionary strategists fearlessly embody our core value of “beginning where others are” and point them toward a horizon where Jesus reigns.

Another journey this year was to a country in Central Asia's 10/40 window (hint: it's one of the “-stans”), where I witnessed the courage and ingenuity of local church planters amidst oppressive circumstances. While permitted to worship, evangelism is prohibited by law, and all churches are closely monitored by the State. Yet despite this, over 50 vibrant churches have been planted! Our local missionaries' deep cultural wisdom allows the Gospel to spread underground. While other organizations are beginning to adopt this model, Missions Door's decades of experience in vetting and empowering local leaders with the right character, calling, and skills set us apart.

In 2024, your support has fueled these extraordinary outcomes. From the Amazon's depths to Central Asia's hidden churches, and from North America's urban margins to its ethnic enclaves, Missions Door is planting healthy, local churches that multiply disciples and transform communities. Together, we are igniting a global movement where castaways become beloved children of God, and Jesus is glorified.

In 2024, our Missionary Care team (which consists of Chris Deemer, Chery Klingsmith, Edwin Colon, Janet Lehman, and me) demonstrated exceptional dedication to supporting our missionaries across various regions and missional/cultural contexts. We effectively divided our responsibilities to cover the Board of Directors, office staff, SALT, Western U.S. (Janet and I), Eastern U.S. and Canada (Edwin Colon), campus ministries (Chris Deemer), and international missionaries (Chery Klingsmith). This small but significant adjustment resulted in 95% of our missionaries receiving direct contact and support from Missionary Care last year.

We also implemented a new approach towards Missionary Care. Where in previous years our model has been primarily reactive and crisis-oriented, we built out and tested a proactive and preventative one, which has been met with overwhelmingly positive feedback. Much of our energy was used to be spent on addressing marital struggles, leadership challenges, burnout, parenting difficulties, etc. Our team is now in the position to allocate 70% of its efforts towards proactive care (maintenance counseling, coaching on creating systems that promote a healthy work-life balance, etc.) and only 30% to crisis response! This strategic shift aims to foster long-term health and resilience among our missionaries, ensuring they are better equipped to handle challenges before they escalate.

Financially, the Missionary Care team has successfully raised its entire budget through supporter contributions, amassing approximately \$70,000 in the Missionary Care Fund. These resources have been instrumental in addressing critical needs. One such example is specialized family counseling for a missionary family in Latin America facing unique challenges. This intervention underscores our team's commitment to providing tailored support, no matter the circumstances.

To further develop relationships and provide personalized support, all Missionary Care team members attended the Latin America Regional Meeting in Honduras in January 2025, and are scheduled to participate in the upcoming East and West Coast Regional Team Meetings (June and October 2025, respectively). These gatherings offer valuable opportunities for one-on-one engagement, fostering deeper connections and addressing individual needs.

Looking ahead, we plan to enhance our impact by having each member deliver a ministry talk or seminar on key areas of soul care. Topics will include marital health, thriving as a single missionary, managing burnout, maintaining emotional and spiritual health, practicing spiritual disciplines, and navigating grief. These initiatives will further equip our missionaries to serve effectively and sustainably in their calling!

Looking back on 2024, it's incredible to see how much God has stretched, surprised, and sustained us in ministry. This year was a remarkable blend of growth, transition, and new beginnings—each one reminding us that God's story is always unfolding, even when the path looks uncertain.

When the pandemic hit, campus ministry was impacted by so many unknowns. Our international student ministry in Connecticut was forced off campus, and the flow of new students nearly stopped. It felt like a blow to everything Chris Rowley and his team built. But looking back, we can see how God used that season to refocus their hearts. With fewer students, they poured deeply into the ones God brought to us, shifting from a wide net to a tight-knit community of resilient disciples. That reset changed everything. They embraced a model of “abiding” ministry (rooted in John 15), focusing on spiritual health and multiplication. The first on-campus Easter Celebration with the International Campus Church saw seventy students from all over the world gather to worship Jesus, with thirty more joining for a meal. This church has become a vibrant, multicultural family, with Hindus, Muslims, spiritual seekers, and Christians from all backgrounds coming together! The small group they disciplined during COVID became the foundation for this church, and now they're launching a disciple-making initiative across four campuses in southwest Connecticut, embedding multiplication into our DNA.

Our campuses all experienced a similar journey. In 2021, 17 students decided to follow Jesus across our ministries. That was just the beginning. Over 2022 and 2023, more than 70 new believers joined our community across 16 campuses. We saw a 5% increase in spiritual conversations, and our students became bold in sharing their faith. This fall, we welcomed a 24% jump in leaders-in-training—a sign that the next generation is ready to step up and serve!

At Oneonta, our campus ministry is experiencing explosive growth, with 60 to 70 students gathering each week to worship together and grow in spiritual maturity. Chris Deemer, who's served with the Mission for 50 years, says he's never seen such hunger for the Gospel before. It's stories like these that keep us hopeful and energized.

A YEAR IN REVIEW - Communications

In 2024, Missions Door's Communications Department celebrated a year of remarkable growth, connection, and innovation. Our focus was clear: strengthen communication with and between our missionaries, enhance resources, and amplify our mission through creative storytelling and consistent branding. Here's a look at some of our proudest achievements:

We prioritized missionary support by streamlining our onboarding process for Phase 2 candidates, introducing scheduled check-ins from office staff, and fostering meaningful connections through Missionary Care initiatives. Our Kajabi Circles and informative emails kept missionaries and candidates engaged, while we laid the groundwork for a custom newsletter app so they could better share their stories. We also ceremonialized Phase 3 achievement recognition to better honor our missionaries' milestones.

Resource development was a cornerstone of our efforts. We created original courses on Church Planting Methodologies, webinars, and networking spaces to spark collaboration among teams worldwide. Our X page became a hub for new resources, including book recommendations, team reports, and original course materials. These tools empowered our missionaries with the training and inspiration they needed to take their ministries to greater heights!

Our storytelling took bold steps forward. We filmed our first documentary film on Radha Manickam's ministry across the Pacific Northwest and Cambodia, set for release this summer, as well as published our first e-book to empower older generations to share their stories in a changing world. Our YouTube channel flourished, with 32,239 views, 354.2 watch hours, 135 videos, and 200 shorts published, earning 75.3K impressions and 163 new subscribers. On Meta platforms, we reached 508,663 on Facebook with 304,647 views and saw 1,681 views on Instagram, growing our follower base by 175 and 15, respectively.

Additionally, we developed four mobile apps—two public, two private—for English and Spanish audiences. These apps are designed to enhance networking and resource sharing. Our consistent brand identity, evident in all videos and publications like this Annual Report, unified our voice and vision!

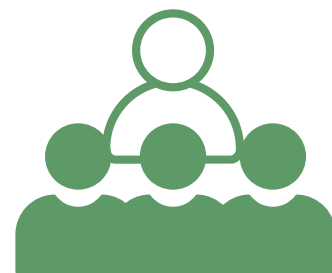

“People forget how resilient people in small towns are,” says Larisa Craig, a Missions Door Castaways missionary serving across the vast, overlooked stretches of rural California and Nevada. While many Christian leaders gravitate toward larger, more resourced communities, Larisa intentionally goes where others won’t—focusing exclusively on towns with 7,000 people or fewer. These are communities that are too often ignored, underfunded, and spiritually underserved. But Larisa knows: God has not forgotten them.

The daughter of missionaries, Larisa never planned on following the same path. But after her father suffered a severe burn accident, her heart was broken open for the very people he had served—kids scattered across isolated desert towns. At just 15 years old, she joined a Vacation Bible School in a remote Nevada town, ministering to children from preschool to sixth grade. It was there she first saw the desperate need for gospel outreach to all ages in these overlooked places.

Today, Larisa drives 4,000 to 6,000 miles every month to bring the hope of Christ to children and families in some of the poorest counties in the United States. Her car is a rolling outpost of ministry—filled with school supplies, toys, curriculum, and the joy of someone who believes every child is worth the time. Through her presence, conversations, and consistency, she’s building trust and planting seeds of faith in young hearts that the world often overlooks.

Larisa doesn’t work alone—she invites others to come alongside her. “Ride with me,” she says. “Share Christ with these kids who are forgotten by everyone else.” Her work is gritty, faithful, and absolutely essential. What’s more, it reminds us that the mission field isn’t always across the ocean—it’s often just off the highway, in towns most people drive past without a second glance.

Through Larisa Craig, Missions Door is not only reaching the forgotten—it is honoring their resilience, serving their needs, and offering the transforming love of Jesus in places where few are willing to go.

For the past 16 years, Marcos Céspedes and his wife Delmis have tirelessly worked as church planters and missionaries in Spain—a country where less than 1% of the population identifies as evangelical Christian. Originally from Cuba, Marcos came to faith under extraordinarily difficult circumstances. While attending a state-run boarding school, where owning a Bible or speaking about religion was forbidden, he met two young peers whose quiet but bold witness led him to discover the message of Jesus.

Marcos' spiritual journey took root through secret Bible discussions and youth gatherings, often held in hiding. When he and his wife, who came to Christ at age 18, felt called to help plant a church, their first gatherings took place under the open sky in a friend's nearby mango grove. From those humble beginnings, Marcos sensed a clear call to missions. He pursued seminary training and eventually discerned that God was calling him to serve cross-culturally, though he had no idea where or how that would unfold.

The answer came through a divine appointment. During a brief trip to Spain, Marcos met a local missionary and, by the end of that week, a stranger he has never seen since paid his entire way to move from Cuba to Spain! There, he and his wife fell in love with the historic city of Seville—a place rich in Catholic tradition but spiritually dry. Spain, despite its Christian heritage, ranks as the fifth most atheistic country in the world and harbors deep-rooted cultural skepticism toward evangelicals, often confusing them with sects or cults due to centuries of misunderstanding and persecution.

Undeterred, Marcos and his family began living missionally—inviting neighbors into their home, sharing meals, raising their children in community, and gently introducing conversations about faith. From these organic relationships, their church Esperanza para el Corazón ("Hope for the Heart") was born. Now six years old, the church is preparing to plant a daughter church, extending its reach in a nation that desperately needs re-evangelization, as presently over 4,000 villages still have no evangelical presence.

Marcos' story is one of perseverance, vision, and hope. Through his efforts, Missions Door is investing in one of the most spiritually resistant regions of Europe, showing that the gospel still transforms hearts, one relationship at a time.

Ryan Miller serves as the Campus Ministry Director for Missions Door and is the founding pastor of Damascus Road Church on the University of Arizona's Tucson Campus. Born in Corvallis, Oregon, Ryan grew up immersed in ministry. The son of former Missions Door President Rick Miller, his childhood and faith journey were profoundly shaped by a constant exposure to missionaries and church planting efforts across the globe.

Though Ryan made an initial decision to follow Christ at the age of six, it wasn't until high school and college that his faith would mature. He describes a transformative “grace explosion” during his transition into adulthood, where he realized that God’s love could not be earned—it was already complete. That shift changed how he saw others: no longer as “projects” to “fix” or “win over,” he began to understand the necessity for incarnational evangelism: loving others as God loves them, regardless of reciprocity.

Sensing a vocational call to ministry early on, Ryan eventually became the founding pastor of Damascus Road Church. As he and his team searched for a university town large enough to sustain post-graduate life and gospel impact, Tucson, with its vibrant culture, outdoor lifestyle, and spiritual needs, stood out as a unique and powerful mission field. Damascus Road would be launched in 2006 as a collegiate church meeting directly on campus, but no one could anticipate the impact this would have nearly twenty years later.

From the beginning, Damascus Road was never intended to be a traditional family church with a permanent off-campus facility. Its mission was always to stand in the gap for the often-overlooked 18–30 age group—those who tend to leave church after high school and only return once they start families of their own. Yet over time, God has brought multigenerational growth, with families now worshiping alongside students, and has birthed a holistic missions movement to the city of Tucson and beyond. Students now lead in worship, are trained to preach, serve children, engage in local outreach to the homeless and food-insecure, and participate in missions trips both domestically and internationally—embodying the gospel not just on Sundays, but throughout the week and to their families (and nations) of origin.

Through Ryan’s leadership, Damascus Road and Missions Door are strategically positioned to meet students in one of life’s most formative seasons, inviting them into a deeper, lasting journey with Jesus. To learn how you can pray for and support them, visit his missionary page at the QR code below!

Mission Door's organizational theme for 2024 can be summarized into two words: **Build Loops**. A loop, simply put, is a process that "loops" the outputs of a given system back as inputs. Over the course of 2024, Missions Door worked to build these loops across 4 areas: **heart, head, hands, and feet**. These are just some of the organizational successes we were able to celebrate as each of these areas were completed, and give a small look to how Missions Door will thrive over the coming years:

Heart:

- We worked to create an affinity for onlookers with our organization, whether they were involved with us or not, via our merch store, where people can wear our logo, values, and vision. All funds from this store go back into our general budget to help us identify, network, resource, and encourage local multipliers everywhere.

Head:

- We built an engagement loop to enable our missionaries across the globe to better share ideas and strategies for cultural engagement with one another via original coursework, conferences, webinars, etc. *by* Missions Door, *for* Missions Door! Now, more and more local multipliers can connect and ideate together on successes and skills learned in their respective corners of God's vineyard.

Hands:

- We built 4 mobile phone apps (2 in English, 2 in Spanish), available on both Google Play and the Apple App Store! This is to enable greater portability and accessibility of materials for our missionaries everywhere. One of these is a public-facing app, where missionaries can easily share elements from our website, our social media channels, teaching materials, etc., with prospective partners at the touch of a button. The other is a private app only for Missions Door Missionaries, where they can access and send out newsletters to their supporters, receive training materials, send reports, manage funds, etc.

Feet:

- We've created a value-add package for prospective church partners in the form of a sermon series on missions and local multiplication, complete with small group materials and points for connection with Missions Door Missionaries around the globe! These materials are currently being tested among 12 different partner churches, and we look forward to making them available to the greater public over the coming weeks!

Additionally, we hired our Communications Integration Manager, Mallory Webster, who has been integral in onboarding new candidates across our three application phases, as well as facilitating the creation of these new technical tools our missionaries everywhere get to enjoy! 2024 has been an incredible year for our organization, and with these loops now spinning, we are excited to see what heights 2025 will bring!

MD Communities

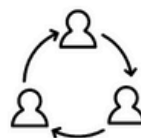
